<u>Course Goal:</u> The purpose of this course is to introduce basic concepts of incident management and the ICS and to provide a basis for application of ICS to a variety of incidents. Successful completion of the course fulfills the requirements for ICS 100 and 200.

**Course Description:** The students will examine the Incident Command System (ICS) organization and related forms. They will share experiences from their jurisdictions and organizations. This learning experience will empower the students to better understand and participate in the ICS activities of the home jurisdictions

**<u>Description of Methodology:</u>** This course will be delivered using lecture, facilitated discussion, small group exercises and activities, and facilitated scenario response.

**Student Equipment & Supplies:** Students will need the *Incident Command System and Resource Management for the Fire Service* student manual, notebook, and pen or pencil.
